

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Students on F-1 Visa must submit a one time International Application for Admission with the non-refundable fee of \$300. At the time of enrollment, students are required to pay one-quarter tuition.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

Payments can be made by Cash, Check, Visa, MasterCard, American Express, or Discover card according to the payment options listed below.

- **Option one:** Single payment of full tuition before registration for the quarter.
- **Option two:** One-half of the tuition to be paid before registration, the other half due four weeks after classes begin with an additional charge of \$10.

Refunds: If a refund is applicable, the amount will be processed within 30 days of the receipt of a written request.

NOTE

Service fee of 3.5% will be charged for payments made by credit cards and \$20 for payments by check.

NOTE: The amounts shown are the maximum amounts that you may borrow for an academic year (annual loan limits) and in total (aggregate loan limits). You might receive less than the maximum if you receive other financial aid that's used to cover a portion of your cost of attendance. The maximum amount that you may borrow will also be less in certain situations, such as if you are an undergraduate student enrolled in a program of study that is shorter than an academic year.

PLUS is a federal loan program for dependent undergraduate students. Generally, parents are eligible if they do not have an adverse credit history and are not in default on a federal student loan.

Housing cost may be included in the financial aid package to qualifying students otherwise the amount of loans is limited to tuition, fees, and books only.

SCHOLARSHIPS OFFERED BY EAST-WEST UNIVERSITY

Only full-time students (taking a minimum of 12 credit hours per quarter) are eligible for one of the following scholarships except the Merit Scholarship which can be combined with one additional scholarship.

**To be eligible for the following scholarships, a student must complete his/her degree program (Associate and/or Bachelor's) and maintain a minimum GPA as listed under each specific scholarship. A student must continue as full-time without interruption until graduation. Students may carry the cumulative scholarship balance, interest free, from quarter to quarter. The entire amount of the accumulative scholarship will be credited to the student's account upon completion of the degree at East-West University.*
