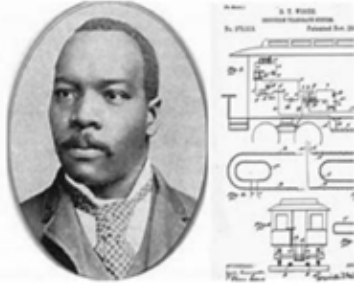


Shakespeare Inspired Sonnet

One of his inventions is the Synchronous Multiplex Railway Telegraph, a variation of the induction telegraph that relied on ambient static electricity from existing telegraph lines to send messages between train stations and moving trains. 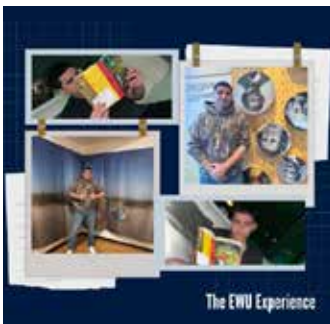
Benjamin Banneker was a self-educated astronomer, mathematician, and a farmer.

BOOK REVIEWS BY ALYSSA HERNANDEZ

The novel *Push* is based around Precious and her hardships throughout life. The hardships Precious has faced are some people today. There are also many social issues that Precious struggles with in which we will get into. Family rape is discussed in the book. Since she was young Precious was raped by her mother and father. Abuse is also included, not only was Precious abused physically, she was abused mentally. Due to her environment, Precious was also very shy and insecure. Lastly, we will get into government funding and how they were being misused.

By the time Precious was 16 she was pregnant with her second child by her father. While at home Precious was out was being raped by her mother and father. At first, she did not even know she was being raped until later on when speaking about her situation out loud. Everyone's trying to buy, including the staff at the hospital. She was asked who her child's father was when giving birth and she had explained it was her father's and everyone in the hospital is getting a weird look.

On page 59, Precious describes one situation with her mother. "I am joking between her legs a huh a huh. She is smelling big woman smell. She say suck it lick me, Precious. I squeeze my eyes up, but choking don't stop it get worse." Intersection of a Precious is describing her mother raping her, forcing her to perform sexual acts. As a child you're looking for protection from your parents, and this is an example of not only family right but endangerment to a child. Being raped by her mother has for a tremendous amount of stress and can possibly be a cause of Precious's and insecurities.

Page 111 Precious explains her situation with her father. "I can't talk about daddy now. my clits swell up I think daddy daddy is sick me, disgusts me, but still he sex me. I nawshus in my stomach, but hot tight and my twat and I think I want it back the smell of the bedroom that hurt. He slapped my face until it stink in my ears sing separate songs from each other. Call me names pop my pussy in and out in and out awwwwww i come." In this section person is describing the conflict between her feelings for her father and the body reaction from being raped. She doesn't know how to feel, she has to forgive her father for violating her, but her body is giving her a reaction as she is confused. Children look at their parents as protectors and providers. As we can see from this novel both the mother and the father of Precious were not protectors. Both parents raped their daughter at such a young age, at one point Precious, did not know she was even being raped. Before Precious even grew up and became a teenager she had already given birth to one child from her father and the second by the time she was 16.

Precious is also very insecure. She had troubles with reading and writing, but she was too scared to speak up for help. She did not want anyone to think she was dumb. She did not want anyone to bully her. She did not want anyone to know she was struggling.

In the beginning of the book, Precious stated that everything in the book she reads I'll look the same, explaining how she has a learning disability. When she starts alternative school, she speaks up and tells her teacher how she is struggling with reading. On page 54, her teacher says, "I think I understand your Precious but for now I want you to try to push yourself to go for it." This is an example of how a Precious seizure pushed her to do better and gave her the encouragement that possibly no other teacher has given her. Demotivation was very different for Precious because she was not used to having someone on her side or someone to help her.

Precious going to alternative school actually helped her in many ways. She was so used to sitting in the back of the class and being ignored that when she went into a smaller class in the alternative school, she was more comfortable, and she actually stated her struggles. Before going into alternative school Precious was shy and didn't really speak to any other students, in this alternative school she is now more open and willing to let others know she needs help.

In all honesty, I believe that Precious's mother was just as lost as Precious. Neither Precious nor her mother had the proper resources that help that they need in life. This family solely depended on government assistance and welfare and did anything they could to make sure nothing interrupted government funds. I don't believe that Precious's mother had the guidance she needed to have growing up.

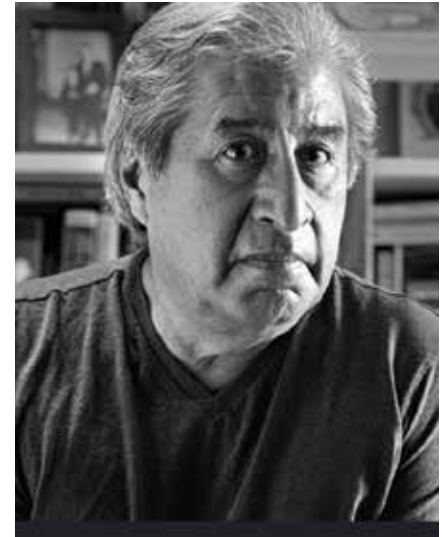


Hunger of Memory

I could tell the author, Richard Rodriguez, is a humble person, while reading 'Hunger of Memory'. He speaks on his achievements, but he does give credit to his schooling and teachers. Rodriguez' family situation is relatable to a lot of people, he was picked on at home for being the bookworm of his family. I find this text interesting, because I never paid attention to the different environments between school and home. Growing up, I was always told I acted out at home but was an angel at school and was often asked why?. I thought this was all a part of code switching, which in fact it is. But there is a deeper meaning, my academic world set certain boundaries in which at home they were not established. I like the example that was used, home being too nosy to do homework or study. We're all taught to study at home but in certain homes it is too nosy to focus, making it impossible to study. Our brains are taught to function and focus harder in school, versus at home where the students, we, don't have. As students we are taught to listen in school and be good. Parents often rewarded their children with gifts for behaving in school. In some homes getting in trouble in school means you are expecting to have some sort of punishment at home.

I noticed that Rodriguez was getting more and more drawn to school, and distancing himself from his family. I feel like he was doing this because he was getting picked on at home, and school was an outlet for him. A place where he felt loved and appreciated, which had drawn him more to his teachers. Rodriguez's mother had tried to connect with her son by telling him to pick a book for her to read, as a way to let her son feel that she was there for him. I thought it was cruel that he had given her a hard book to read like Willa Cather's *My Antonia*. Richard's parents didn't have the best English skills, so why would he give her such a hard book? As I was reading this short story, I felt like Richard was just a sensitive boy, growing up in a typical hispanic household full of chaos and teasing. He could not handle the household as well as everyone else, he put his focus on school and tried his hardest to get away from his home life.

Richard Rodriguez is similar to some characters in other books we are reading in urban literature. Alex from *American Skin*, he was a young lost boy who longed for love and protection. Alex had to basically fight throughout his life and he ran into different groups that were not the best to hang around, but because they offered protection he gravitated towards them. Precious in *Push* by Sapphire used school (alternative schooling) to escape the world of abuse and raped endured in her home. Much like Richard, Precious rather be in class than at home. These characters can all relate to each other. All these kids wanted was love.



The summer of 1967 seemed like an incredible time to live in. The summer of love started a revolutionary movement.. During this specific time, groups of young adults and teens from London began to migrate into California. This is where everything changes., "With so much going on in the world, these migrants from London were unifying and changing their community. There were a lot of changes that were made, for example clothes. Before the summer of love, women and men both wore clothes that covered up their body for the most part. During the summer of love, clothes had gotten brighter in , color wise, and shorter, so now more skin was showing. There were many norms that were in place, and this was the beginning of a culture changing. Take Twiggy for example, she wore short mini skirts and had short hair, unlike the individuals in modern families that had longer hair and longer skirts to cover up.

This era opened so many eyes to different looks and sounds; there were more and more black people listening to pop music and white people giving soul music a chance. In 1967, the hippies started to seek change and rebel against their parents. One thing I found interesting about this video was that , one of the speakers said the hippies brought wisdom, and to a certain extent I agree- the hippies came in and changed the game, because they brought everyone out of their shells and opened them up to try new things. I also found it interesting that there were people who were actually getting arrested because they were joining the hippie movement and parents saw it as them throwing away their name or something of some sort. I don't think hippies were arrested for joining the movement itself, but it is true that the drugs increased arrests for drug related crimes. The drug LSD also played a huge role. LSD opened up so many minds to a whole new world or discoveries that had been blocked by parents. Once these teens and young adults started to rebel and expand their horizons, parents brushed it off as if the children or teens are going through a phase. I found this odd because besides the drugs, why didn't the parents see this as a beautiful thing, a reunification of cultures. personally i think this culture was so strong and amazing, they weren't afraid of trying new things or going against a parent. Overall I do think we should do this again. It had an impact on everyone, they walked through a culture shock to create change.

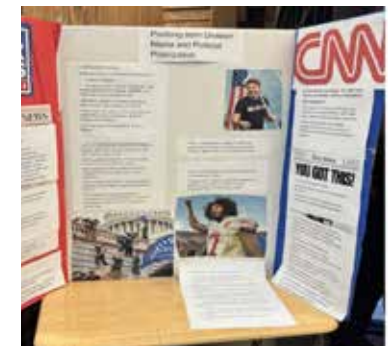
Senior Seminar Projects

The poster on “What is the Role of Digital Media in Societal Division?” covers the breakdown of how online media is responsible for polarization nicely, and I was particularly interested in the section on algorithmic echo chambers. How social media personalized content to reinforce users’ already-held ideologies was the most engaging, considering the example of Facebook’s News Feed algorithm and the vitriol that has been hurled against it for widening ideological gaps. I also liked how the poster pointed out emotional manipulation and outrage culture, how sensationalized content gets people’s attention but contributes to polarization. The solutions were also interesting, particularly the call for media literacy education and transparency with algorithms, because those are measures that can be taken practically to reduce polarization. Overall, the study is informative, and the layout makes it simple to read through and stay interested. - *Coby San Juan*

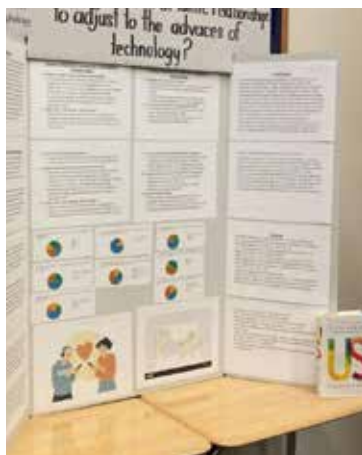
“Is The Internet changing the way our Brain works?”

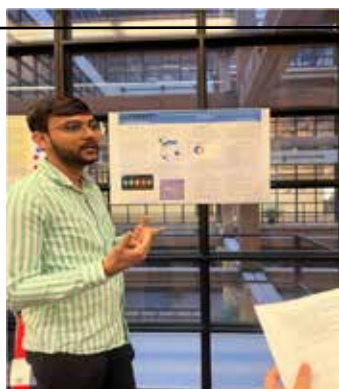
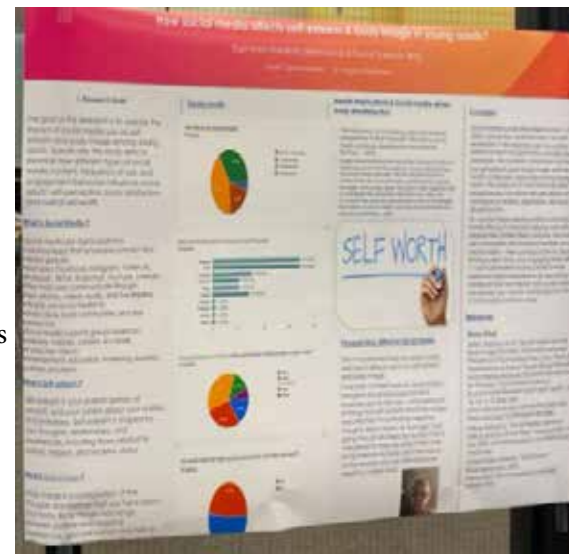

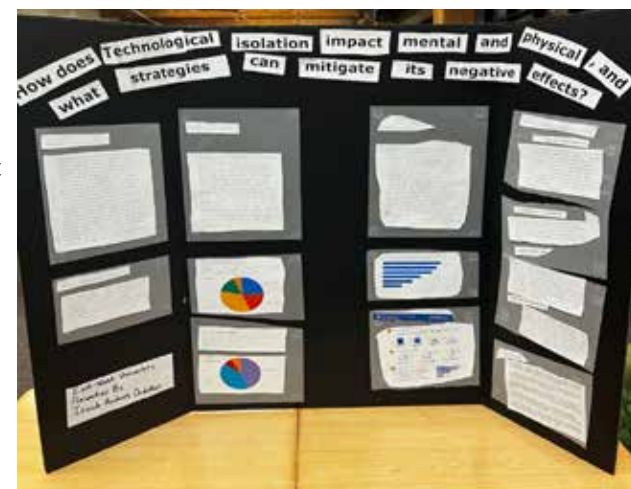
